

Thank you for volunteering!

Adult volunteers are vitally important to the success of 4-H Alberta, and there is great benefit to having them registered for communication and opportunity purposes. This form is to be completed by any adult who wishes to provide support to club, district, region or provincial 4-H activities.

As adult volunteers, your time and commitment to 4-H Alberta is a cornerstone to making this organization a success for another 100 years. You are vitally important! 4-H Alberta is working to improve how we track the involvement of our vital adult volunteers. The purpose of this is for safety and risk management, to clearly communicate your roles and responsibilities, and to offer parents insight into the types of people that will help their child succeed in 4-H Alberta. As such, 4-H Alberta has initiated **3 categories** for adults to be registered in the online registration system for every 4-H Alberta Club, District and/or Region:

Trained Leader:

- Adults (18+) who hold a position of trust while mentoring youth, having responsibility/ authority for any financial matters or business activities, making any decisions on behalf of members, volunteers, or families and/or are perceived to be in a position of power.
- *Must be elected* by the club
- *Must complete 4-H Screening by Dec. 15.*
- *Must complete Commit to Kids (Abuse Prevention and Duty to Report) training* by Jan. 1
- *Must complete Youth Safety at 4-H in Canada training* by May 1.
- Whenever working with youth, they must also have a second trained leader or a screened volunteer present.
- For specific information about the description and duties of the position you are interested in, or have been asked to assume, please speak with the other volunteers with your 4-H club.

Screened Volunteer:

- Adults (18+), not elected as leaders, but who wish to provide support to the club, district, region or provincial activities, and may also be perceived as holding a position of trust.
- *Must complete 4-H Screening by Dec. 15*
- *Must always have a Trained Leader present* when working with youth
- Is welcome to complete Commit to Kids and Youth Safety training as well to provide more support to the club

Supporter:

- Adults (18+), who do not wish to complete 4-H Screening
- May not hold positions of trust.
- *May only volunteer under the supervision of a trained leader, and a second trained leader or a screened volunteer.*
- Support is provided at a club, district, regional, or provincial level through volunteer activities such as setting up venues, ongoing financial contributions, etc.

Trained Leaders and Screened Volunteers are invited to attend provincial and national educational opportunities (*leader training and conferences, project specific activities, etc.*). These events are stepping-stones for volunteers to build skills and develop into future leaders. Travel opportunities are also open to both Trained Leaders and Screened Volunteers, though additional training may be required for Screened Volunteers before travelling.

Once your club has completed their registration with 4-H Alberta, you will receive an email with your username and password for your profile in the online registration system. Please log in and:

- Confirm that your personal information is correct
- Check your Canada Anti-Spam Legislation (CASL) agreement/disagreement.
 - 4-H Alberta, RR1 Site 7 Box 1, Westeros AB T0C 2V0, collects your email address to be used to send you regional and provincial newsletters, event notifications, sponsorship and promotional information and other information about 4-H. It is collected under the authority of and is subject to the Personal Information Protection Act (PIPA). We respect your privacy and do not rent, sell, trade or share our mailing lists.

You must “agree” in order to receive these emails.

*If you have multiple family members with the same email address it is best to agree on all individuals so that email information targeted to a specific age group is still received. Families will only receive one copy of an email sent to everyone, as duplicates are removed.
