# Youth Water Council Project

November and December 2021

A new special pilot project to create a Youth Water Council is coming this Fall. If you want to make a difference to help Albertans understand how Alberta's rivers and lakes are managed, then this pilot project is for you.

The Youth Water Council will harness your learning, leadership, and creativity skills by putting you in the driver seat to:

- 1) Learn about the rules for taking water from Alberta's rivers and lakes, and why those rules are important.
- 2) Decide on and design ways to communicate the rules to Albertans.

This pilot project will focus on senior 4-H members from the East Central region. It includes five virtual evening sessions (tentatively November 1, 8, 15, 22, and 29) and an intensive in-person weekend session (tentatively December 10, 11, and 12, likely in the Hanna area) during which the Council members will:

- Hear from and question experts in water regulation, environmental science, and communications.
- Explore different perspectives around withdrawing water from the environment.
- Design target audience "avatars" and decide how to focus their communications projects by getting input from their fellow club and community members.
- Create a project to communicate to Albertans what the council has learned and feels is important.

Registration will be available in September, so keep an eye on your email and social media for the registration opening announcement!

4-H Alberta Ambassadors are enthusiastic 4-H Senior Members who are driven to grow 4-H in Alberta through sharing their 4-H experiences and representing 4-H youth! 4-H Ambassadors will support 4-H in their region and across the province. Ambassadors will receive training and gain experience in an area of their interest. As an Ambassador, you will learn valuable skills that will help you in your future endeavours. Apply today for an opportunity to be an advocate for 4-H youth and help make 4-H the best it can be!

Two Ambassadors per region (14 in total) will be selected through the application process, for a two-year term.

4-H Alberta Ambassadors will be divided into special interest groups where they will work with mentors in their areas of interest to learn and gain experience. The special interest groups include:

- 4-H Programs
- Projects and Member Resources
- Marketing and Social Media
- Community Outreach and Communications
- 4-H Structure and Governance
- Sponsor Engagement and Fund Development

#### Ambassador Requirements:

- Has completed at least 3 years as a 4-H Alberta Member
- 🏶 Is a current Senior Member in good standing
- Possesses strong leadership, communication, and teamwork skills
- Passionate about growing and promoting 4-H in Alberta
- Commits to attending at least 4 events/programs/opportunities per year with 4-H, in their region or across the province, as an Ambassador
- Attend and complete the Ambassador Training on SUNDAY, OCTOBER 24, following the Senior Symposium
- Attend virtual monthly check-in meetings with all Ambassadors

A note for all applicants: If you are submitting your application to be a 4-H Alberta Ambassador, plan on attending the Senior Symposium on October 22–24 at the Camrose Resort Casino Hotel. Online registration is now open. Successful applicants will be required to attend the Ambassador Training on Sunday, October 24 immediately following the Symposium.

The application form includes a spot for you to answer questions about becoming an Ambassador, and create and submit a video that shows who you are! You will also submit three references: one from a 4-H Leader, a non-4-H'er, and a peer.

Applicants may be scheduled for a short interview with a small panel to help with the selection process. Interview times will be flexible with your busy schedules.

The 14 selected Ambassadors will be announced during a live virtual event on the evening of WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 13!

Ambassadors will be selected based on how they demonstrate the following personal qualities and attributes in their application:

- Involvement in 4-H
- Seadership both within and outside of 4-H
- Scontributions to their club, community, country, and world
- Individuality (confidence in who YOU are)

# 4-H Alberta Implements a New Payment Processing System

Just a gentle reminder that 4-H Alberta has moved to <u>Plooto</u>, our new online payment platform.



For upcoming payments, 4-H Alberta will ask your club or organization leader to provide their preferred email address for payments. This includes disbursements such as club funding through sponsors and supporters as well as our Alberta Tire and Electronic Recycling Program.

The owner of the email address must have access to the club's account information. 4-H Alberta will provide the designated club contact with a unique security question and password.

Your club will be able to accept the payment as an electronic fund transfer (e-transfer). You will also have the option to complete your banking information for future transfers. Clubs are responsible for information accuracy and future changes.

Keep an eye on the 4-H Alberta website in the coming weeks, as we will provide a step-by-step guide on how to accept payments and include detailed instructions with every payment notification.
