

Tees Wranglers 4H Rodeo June 26th, 2022

Located at the Tees Rodeo Grounds at the junction of Hwy 12 and Hwy 821
Lots of free camping without hook-ups. You are welcome to come Saturday night.

Saturday - 10:00 start with a grand entry.
Cleaver Event after the Steer Riding. Award presentation to follow.

Fees: \$5 for non-stock events. \$10 Stock events.

Order of Events: Barrels, Pole Bending, Thread the Needle, Goat Tying, Breakaway Roping, Team Roping and Steer Riding. There will be a short lunch break each day close to noon.

All contestants must wear a helmet while on their horses. Rodeo attire is required in the arena(long sleeve button or snap shirts(no zippers), jeans and cowboy boots).
The same attire plus a western hat is required to receive ribbons and prizes.

General Rules

1. Prizes 1 - 3 places will be awarded in each event on each day. In case of a tie, ties will be awarded as well.
2. Ages as of January 1 of current year: Juniors 9 - 11 Years, Intermediates 12 - 14 Years, Seniors 15-20 Years.
3. A member may substitute another horse for their project horse and receive points/prizes if the member can provide a veterinary certificate and written permission from their 4-H leader. During the rodeo, if a horse becomes lame, the Tees Wranglers committee may allow a substitution.
4. Tees Wranglers club is not responsible for injuries. 4-H Incident Report must be completed and filed.
5. Members who participate in steer riding must have had instruction in steer riding and provide written proof either with a certificate of completion from a school or practice night provided by the Wranglers.
6. Open gate for all roping events.

7. Catch as catch can as long as the rope goes over the animal's head.
8. All breakaway ropers may come out of the right or left hand box.
9. If a parent or member interferes with or harasses a judge, that member, and/or the child of the parent will be disqualified by the Tees Wranglers rodeo committee.
10. Any member taking part in steer riding MUST supply their own equipment: rope, bell, protective vest, approved helmet with face mask, mouth guard, gloves. Chaps are optional.
11. There will be a Cleaver Kids event at this rodeo.
12. Turn out fee (entry fee) must be paid prior to competing in the next rodeo.
13. Any member grievance must be taken forward by the 4-H club leader/chaperone to the Tees Wranglers Rodeo committee. All grievances must be written and be accompanied with a \$20 fee prior to being discussed.
14. No run ins or outs allowed.
15. All animals must be treated humanely at all times. This includes proper care and handling. Disqualification of any participant using an animal that is obviously sore, lame, or injured in any way. Disqualification and/or removal from an event or the entire rodeo, of any person who is abusive to any animal.
16. Closed and latched gate for all speed events
17. The aggregate prizes will be based on the ranking system outlined on separate handout.
18. Team Ropers should enter as a team. You may enter once as a header and once as a heeler.

Special Rules for Buckles and Tiebreakers

We have gotten really nice 1st to 3rd Aggregate buckles for each age level.

We want to make sure all prizes are awarded. This means we will have some special rules to help make this happen in the team roping, breakaway roping and steer riding. The aggregate rules are outlined below.

Team roping- Normal high point rules. If there is only one stretch over the weekend, this will win the header and heeler buckles. We will be timing all the head catches as well as the stretches in the team roping. If there are no stretches, the fastest head catch will then win the header prize. In order to establish the winning heeler, we will then be putting the head ropes on in the chutes for a 2nd try. The header will then turn the steer for the heeler at a line approx 20 ft from the chute. We will time only the heeler. The faster heel catch will then win the heeler prize.

Breakaway Roping- If there are no catches, we will run the cattle through a second time. If there are still no catches, we will then bring out the roping dummy and a quad. The kids will then rope the dummy out of the box. There will be a line the dummy must cross before the roper gives chase.

Steer Riding- We will time how long each contestant rides. If there are no qualified rides, then the longest ride in each age category will then win.

Aggregate Buckles

Aggregate Definition: formed or calculated by the combination of many separate units or items.

The purpose of these awards are to reward participation and consistency. The aggregate buckles will be given to the competitors with the highest, second highest and third highest rank in the most events in their respective categories: Jr, Int, Sr. Competitors will be ranked in each event from 1st place, all the way down to the lowest qualified time or score in each event.

Example: A competitor finishing 10th in barrel racing would have a 10 added to their aggregate total. A competitor finishing 1st would have a 1 added to their aggregate total.

Example: A competitor receiving qualified times or scores in 5 events would beat every competitor who only placed or qualified in 4 or less events. The more events you enter, the better your chances at these Aggregate buckles.

We hope that all contestants have their cowboy hats on when they receive the buckles. We are taking a picture to go in the thank you card for the sponsors. We also will have the winners write in the card explaining the reason they like the buckles or what they enjoyed most at the rodeo and sign it. This will happen during the awards ceremony. We realize it may take a little longer taking a picture with every buckle but it is really important to our club to give the sponsors a really nice keepsake.
