Please know that the application does not need to be completed at once, in fact the application may take several hours from start to finish. The applicant can log in as many times as they wish to complete the application before the deadline. Applicants should save their written components on a separate Microsoft Word document, not google docs, as the formatting will not carry over in some areas.

## **Transcripts**

- We encourage all applicants to order their transcripts no later than MAY 1, 2024 to ensure that the deadline has been met.
- You will need to request an official transcript. If you are in highschool, please request your transcript to be mailed to yourself when you are filing out your application and ask for it to be sent once your diploma marks <u>are final</u>. If you are in post secondary, please request your transcripts to be emailed or mailed to yourself once your spring term is complete. Transcripts can then be emailed to <u>scholarship@4hab.com</u>. It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure 4-H Alberta has received the official transcript by the August 1st deadline.
- If we have not received your transcripts by <u>August 1, 2024</u>, then your application may not be considered for scholarships.

(i.e. If you have participated in 15 Club Activities and 5 of them are also District Activities, you can put 10 in Club Activities and the other 5 in District if they fall in that category.)

- 4-H activities in which you have played a leadership role and used your communication skills.
- Activities that you have volunteered to help improve your community with your 4-H club.

#### Written Questions (typed short answer)

- What is the most valuable skill you learned in 4-H?
- What is the highlight of your 4-H career? Why?
- Did your involvement in 4-H motivate you to get involved in other community groups? How?
- Why do you feel volunteering and community service is important?

# Additional Written Questions (essays) & References

Some scholarships require the submission of short essays or reference letters:

## **CALGARY REGION:**

Calgary Region 4-H Scholarship: Three reference letters are required: one school reference, one community reference, one 4-H reference. The letters must be sealed, with the referee signing the envelope across the seal, and sent to the Calgary Regional 4-H Council mailbox in a single envelope. This requires that the applicant ensure they gather all three references and enclose them in one envelope to mail to the Calgary Regional 4-H Council mailbox: Calgary Regional 4-H Council, P.O. Box 10575, Stn. Main, Airdrie, AB, T4A 0H8



# **EAST CENTRAL REGION:**

Stettler District 4-H Scholarship: Applicants are required to submit two reference letters, one from a 4-H volunteer and the second from an adult that has known the applicant for at least two years and is not a family member. Please send to: Stettler District Scholarship Selection Committee, Box 81 Gadsby, AB, TOC 1KO. Can only receive once.

#### **NORTHWEST REGION:**

- Northwest Region 4-H Scholarship (500 750 words): How have you fulfilled your commitment to the 4-H program and to yourself by following the 4-H Pledge and Motto. Must be an original essay, plagiarism will result in disqualification. Please note that members may not win this scholarship more than once. Members may only win one regional scholarship per year (Northwest Region 4-H Safety Scholarship or Northwest 4-H Scholarship).
- Northwest Region 4-H Safety Scholarship (500-750 words): A topic related to safety. Must be an original essay, plagiarism will result in disqualification. Please note that members may not win this scholarship more than once. Members may only win one regional scholarship per year (Northwest Region 4-H Safety Scholarship or Northwest 4-H Scholarship).

#### **PEACE REGION:**

- Peace Regional Scholarship Essay: Please explain how you believe your experience in 4-H will assist you in pursuing your future academic/career/life goals. The essay needs to be a minimum of 500 words and a maximum of 750 words. Must be a new and original essay each year that the applicant applies. Plagiarism will result in disqualification.
- Valleyview District 4-H Scholarship: Applicants must submit a letter stating their involvement with the Valleyview District Council to the following address: Box 1967, Valleyview, AB TOH 3NO

#### WEST CENTRAL REGION:

**Camrose District 4-H Scholarship:** Applicants are required to submit a reference letter to the following address: (ie. General leader, key leader, assistant leader, project leader, or other 4-H parent, no relative references will be accepted.) Camrose District Scholarship Selection Committee, Box 264, Hay Lakes, AB, TOB 1W0
