Life Skills Open Competition

Each member will submit an entry that documents a skill they have learned or improved on during the course of their project work for the 2023-2024 year. **Members are only eligible for this competition if their project does not have a separate competition.**

The entry must be completed before the event, but a wide variety of possible presentations would be acceptable including, but not limited to: poster, pamphlet, diorama, model, tri-fold, scrapbook page or video (member is responsible for ensuring the judges have a method of viewing the entry and the length is not to exceed 5 minutes).

The entries will be judged on the information presented and the impact of the presentation. Entrants will provide a bibliography of sources used (if applicable). Photos may be used with appropriate credits. Drawings and diagrams may be used as well but must be created by the entrant, not reproduced.

To ensure adequate space, Members will be required to let the Life Skills Committee know what the subject of their entry will be, including the format and approximate size by April 22 2024 – see attached form.
